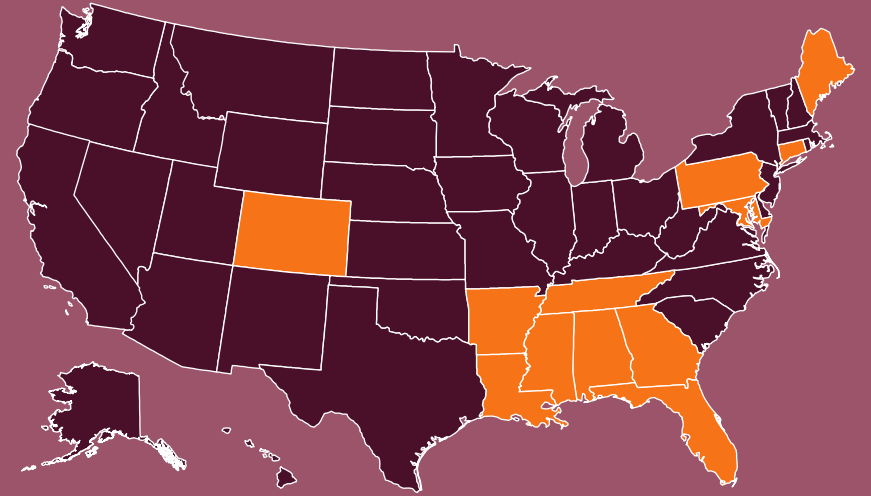

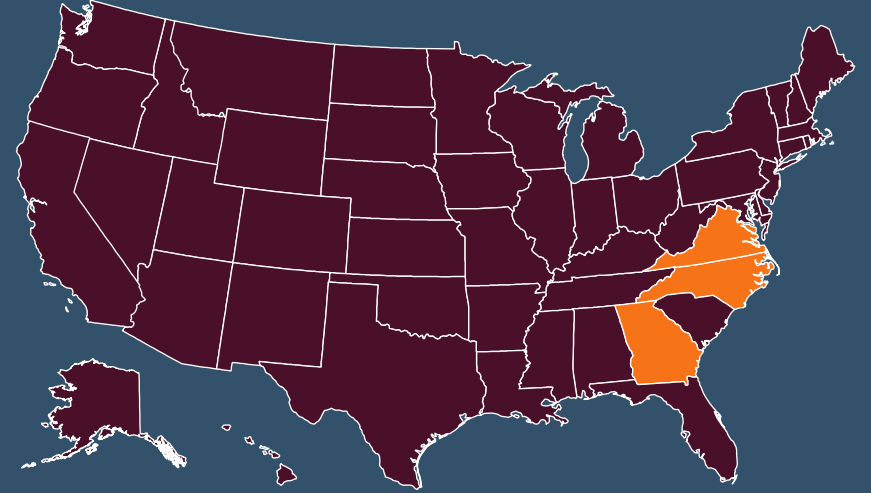


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Central Atlantic Pharmacy Program (CAPP)



The Central Atlantic Pharmacy Program (CAPP) is a pharmacy aggregation group comprised of 9 health systems, representing more than 35 acute care facilities and **\$2.3 billion** in pharmacy spend. Since inception, member hospitals have achieved over **\$100 million** in implementable savings. The group continues to experience member growth and achieves savings through utilization, standardization, and contracting agreements. A variety of categories including 503b outsourced sterile compounding, biosimilars, influenza vaccine, and others are responsible for member value.

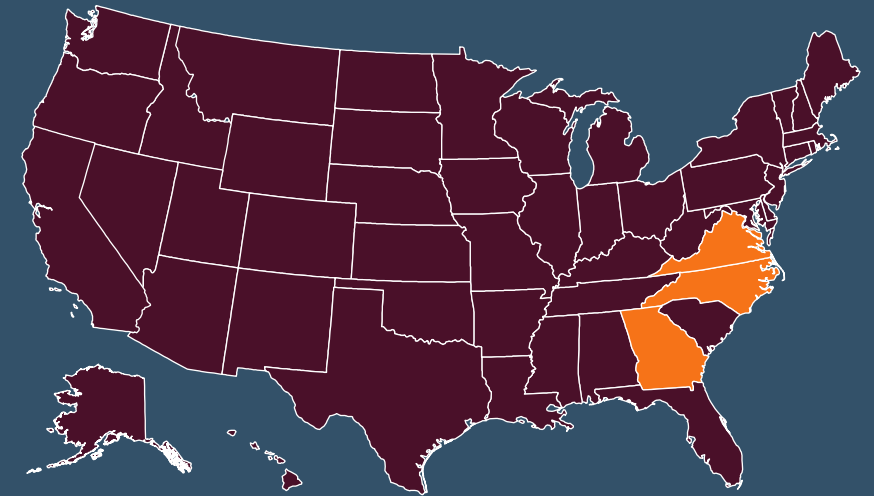

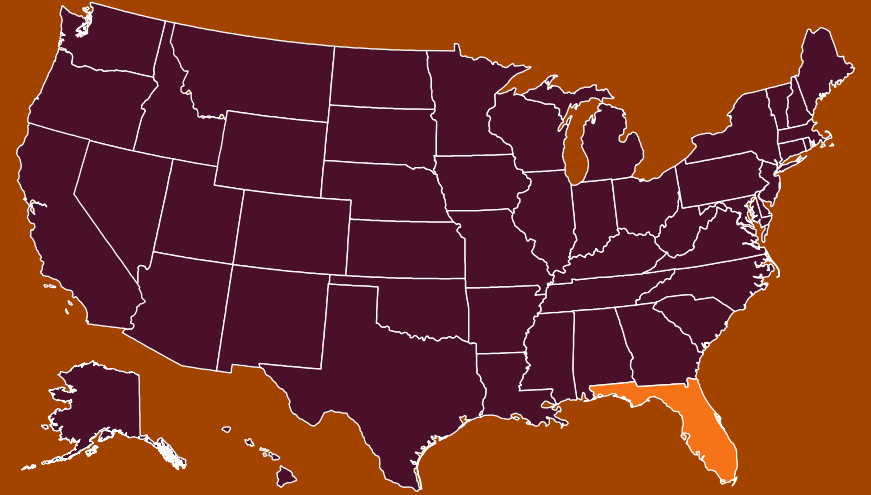

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Cooperative Services of Florida (CSF)



The CSF is a pharmacy aggregation group comprised of CSF as the Vizient member and their 4-owner health systems as members of their regional group purchasing organization (GPO). CSF represents a total of 13 acute care facilities and approximately **\$930 million** in annual pharmacy spend. Since inception in 2019, member hospitals have achieved almost **\$100 million** in implementable savings. The CSF pharmacy aggregation committee is chaired by the Vice President of Pharmacy Services at CSF and comprised of executive leaders from each of their member systems. Furthermore, outside of the pharmacy aggregation, CSF focuses on aggregating member needs to drive competitive contracts that lower cost for medical and pharmaceutical supplies, technologies, and services. In addition to being an aggregation group for Florida health systems pharmacy contracting, CSF has a variety of other pharmaceutical services they provide for their members . This includes two distribution hubs, sterile-to-sterile 503B pharmaceutical compounding, first responder logistic services, pharmacy tray exchange for acute care facilities, nuclear services, and central fill ADC replenishment. These additional services add pharmacy solutions to CSF members that extend their customized service line and create value through lowering costs and reducing waste.

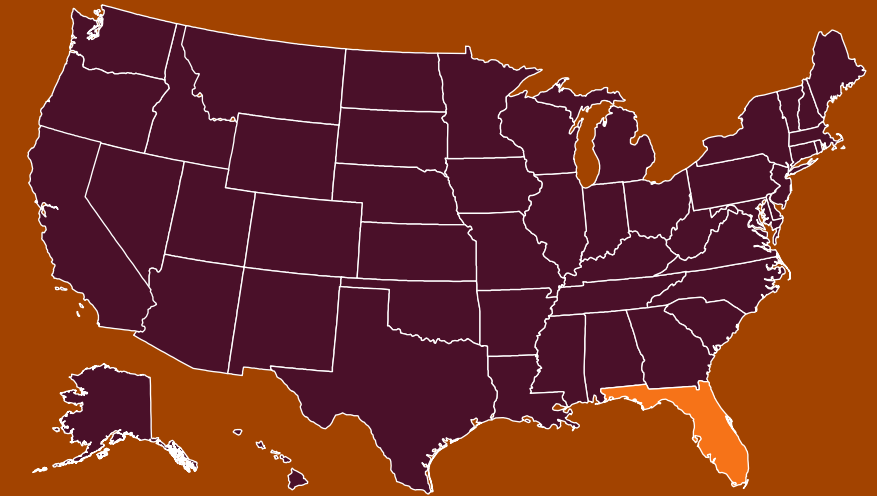

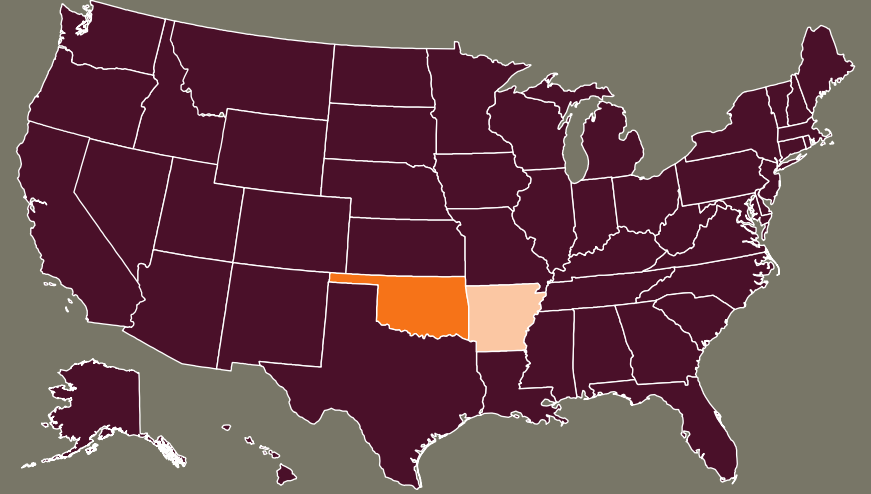

The Heartland Pharmacy Purchasing Partners (HP3) is a pharmacy aggregation group comprised of 10 health systems, representing 45 acute care facilities and approximately **\$450 million** in annual pharmacy spend, of which **\$175 million** (40%) is 340B eligible. Since inception in 2012, member hospitals have achieved **\$195 million** in implementable savings. HP3 attains savings through utilization, standardization, and contracting agreements.

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Mid-America Service Solutions (MSS)



Mid-America Service Solutions (MSS), a Vizient Pharmacy Aggregation Group, currently serves about 70 health systems, representing more than 800 sites of care in the Midwest region with an annual pharmacy aggregation drug spend of more than **\$1.2 billion**. MSS was formed to enable members to aggregate their purchasing volume and go to market as a single committed entity, offering substantial committed purchase volume to suppliers. MSS operations are governed by a Steering Committee, comprised of one executive from each of the health systems representing a majority of member spend. The network was established to build long-term, collaborative partnerships among pharmacy leaders, strengthen health-system pharmacy practice through knowledge sharing, and implement formulary strategies that enhance access to high-quality, cost-effective pharmaceutical care without compromising outcomes. Members have agreed to operate as a single “virtual” IDN, aggregating their purchasing volume and directing market share to strategic suppliers that provide differentiated value. Through standardization and utilization, members have accelerated the benefit of pharmacy aggregation and enhanced contracts. In 2001, Mountain States became the first Vizient region to standardize to a single pharmacy distributor.

Members embrace a “pay it forward” philosophy, recognizing that while individual initiatives may not benefit every organization equally in the short term, all members realize maximum value over time. They understand that upfront commitments are critical, but sustained performance ultimately matters most.

The TPC Pharmacy Network is a pharmacy aggregation comprised of health systems, representing 15 acute care facilities and **over \$298 million** in annual pharmacy spend. The WCPC Purchasing Coalition is a pharmacy aggregation group comprised of 20 health systems, representing approximately 50 acute care, psychiatric, and medical center facilities and a variety of ambulatory clinics and outpatient pharmacies with approximately **\$1.3 billion** in annual pharmacy spend. Since its inception in 2012, member hospitals have achieved more than **\$120 million** in implementable savings. WCPC Pharmacy is led by the Pharmacy Steering Committee, which is comprised of a delegation of seven executive leaders chosen from the broader Membership. Additionally, WCPC attains savings through utilization, standardization, and contracting agreements. WCPC partners with the Mountain States Pharmacy Network to provide access to a competitive distribution contract through McKesson.

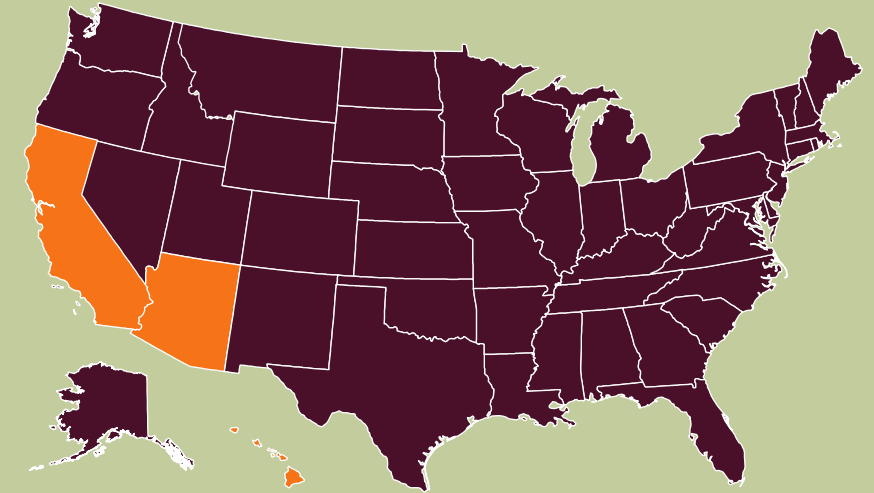

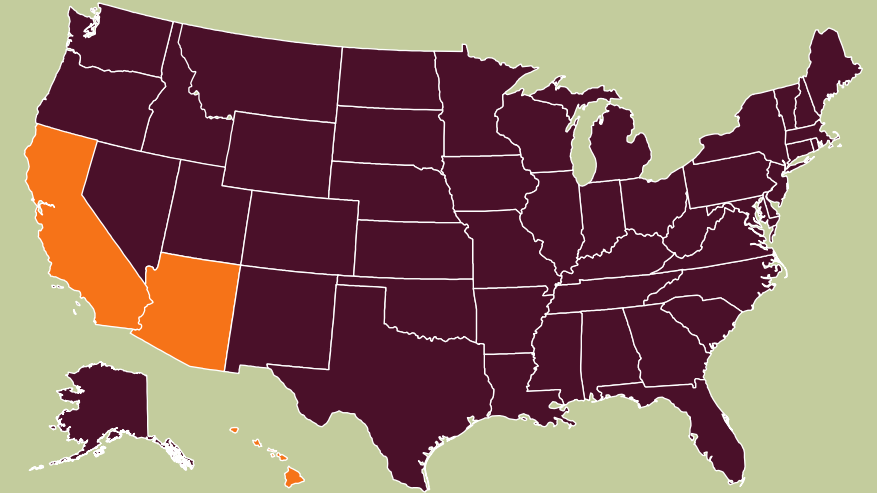

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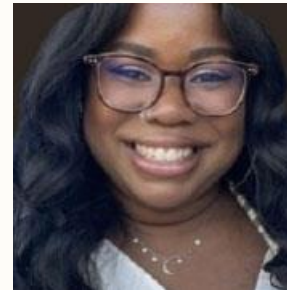
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
