Dear Senators Cardin and Collins,

I am writing today to offer <u>Vizient's</u> support for the Drug Shortages Shelf Life Extension Act (S.3493). Your bipartisan legislation would require the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to share guidance regarding the inclusion of a drug product's longest feasible expiration date in its label. Such information would help mitigate shortages and better ensures that information about a product's expiration date is readily available to providers.

The Drug Shortages Shelf Life Extension Act would require the Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) to provide guidance with new recommendations for manufacturers regarding stability testing and labeling of shelf life expiration dates. Additional information regarding the longest feasible expiration date would streamline inventory management and help prevent drug shortages. Additionally, the legislation would require the FDA to submit a report to the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) and the House Energy and Commerce Committee that includes information on labeling changes requested of manufacturers by the agency. The information collected, such as the rationale for the request, whether the drug was listed on the drug shortage list, whether the request was made during a public health emergency, and whether the manufacturer made the change by the requested date would help shed light on the circumstances in which expiration date-related labeling changes may be needed and help identify potential barriers to such changes.

Vizient is proud to offer our support for your important legislation. The Drug Shortages Shelf Life Extension Act would direct FDA to update guidance to safely extend the shelf life of essential drugs, amid certain drug shortages, allowing providers to continue administering life-saving medication to the patients they serve.
